

REGULATIONS RELATING TO ADMISSION AND EXAMINATION FOR THE SEMESTER-WISE THREE YEAR B.A. / B.SC. / B.MUS. (HONOURS / GENERAL) COURSES OF STUDIES UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (C.B.C.S) CONDUCTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA

- In exercise of the powers conferred by Section-54 of The Calcutta University Act 1979, the University of Calcutta hereby makes the following Regulations For Semester-wise 3 year B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Mus.(Honours/General) Courses of Studies under CBCS,2018.
- These shall apply to every candidate pursuing the above Courses in this University.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in any other regulations or rules for the time being in force the study for the above Courses shall be guided by these Regulations effective from the Academic Session on 2019-2020.

1. Title and Commencement

- These Regulations shall be called THE REGULATIONS FOR SEMESTER-WISE THREE YEAR B.A./B.Sc./B.Mus. (Honours/General) DEGREE PROGRAMMES UNDER CBCS (CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM), UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA UNDER CBCS (CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM), UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA
- These Regulations shall come into force with effect from the academic session 2019-2020.

2. Duration of the Programme

- The 3 year B.A./ B.Sc./B.Mus. (Honours/General) Programme shall be for a minimum duration of six (6) consecutive semesters of six (6) months each, i.e., three (3) years. The odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.
- A candidate pursuing a regular course of study for three-year semester-wise degree course shall have to clear all the semesters in all respects within a span of <u>five years</u> from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which, enrolment of the candidate shall stand cancelled.

3. Applicability of the Regulations

- These regulations shall be applicable to:
- The students who are taking admission to the B.A./B.Sc./B.Mus. (Honours/General) Course from the academic session 2019-2020.
- The students who were admitted in earlier sessions but did not enrol for B.A/B.Sc./B.Mus. (Honours/General) Part I Examinations up to 2019.
- The students who were admitted in earlier sessions and enrolled for B.A./B.Sc./B.Mus. (Honours/General) Part I Examinations but did not appear in Part I Examinations up to 2019.
- The students who were admitted in earlier sessions and appeared in B.A./B.Sc./B.Mus.(Honours/General) Part I Examinations in 2019 or earlier shall continue to be guided by the existing Regulations of Annual System.

ADMISSION REGULATIONS

❖ A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the 3 year (six semesters) B.A./B.Sc./B.Mus. (Honours/General)Course of Studies provided he/she has also passed in English, appearing in an examination of not less than 100 marks and fulfils the conditions as laid down in Clauses 5, 11, 12 and 13.

Candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational examination conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the B.A. (General) 1st year Course of Studies taking the subjects under Humanities Division only.

However, no candidate shall be allowed admission after a lapse of more than 5 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating five years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination.

❖ Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.

- ❖ For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc./B.Mus. (Honours/General) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks. Compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.
- (a) A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:
 - A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination [in case of B.Mus. (Hons.) 45% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks on the subject Music, in the previous qualifying examination].

OR

55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination [in case of B.Mus. (Hons.) 50% marks in the subject Music in the previous qualifying examination].

OR

50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all the clauses are satisfied[in case of B.Mus.(Hons.), 45% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject Music in the prequalifying examination. Candidates shall be admitted on the basis of the Admission Test to be conducted by the College Authority concerned.

(b) Candidates belonging to Reserved Categories taking up Honours Course of Study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.

(c) Reservation Policy for admission in three year (six semesters) degree courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014.

6. Attendance:

- A Student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to appear in the concerned Semester Examinations, provided the other conditions laid down in the regulations are fulfilled.
- A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to appear in the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed compensation fees and fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he/she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.

OUR LIBRARY

Kishore Bharati Bhagini Nivedita (Co-Ed.) College Library is presently situated on the second floor of the college building, and properly arranged and decorated. The college has a well-stocked library with approximately 5,000 books. The library has open-access, where students can get direct access to the books and choose for borrowing.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE

- Two daily newspapers (One Bengali and one English) are available in the library.
- Career guidance books and journals (like Employment News, Karmakshetra, etc.) are available.
- The Reference Section has rare books, dictionaries and encyclopaedias.
- There is computer in the library.
- Wi-Fi connection in college library is available.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- Students should make their library cards within 30 days from the commencement of regular classes.
- **Students** are not permitted to enter the library without library cards
- Library cards will have to be shown at the time of entering the library
- Three library cards (2 for lending and 1 for reference) are provided to the students.
- The library cards are not transferable.
- **Students are responsible for the books they use.**
- Two books of different subjects are issued to a General Course and Honours students can get one book for Honours subject and for Pass subject.
- At the time of issuing a book, every user is expected to examine carefully and the cases of mutilation, defacement or demand should immediately be brought to the notice of the concerned library staff at the issue counter. Subsequently, the person to whom the book was issued last will be held responsible for the condition of the book and he/she must compensate either by binding or repairing the book as decided by the College Librarian.
- Students are allowed to keep the books lent to them up to 7 days at the most.
- Books must be returned by the students on the date specified on the date-label of the book. Defaulters have to pay a fine of Re. 1 per day per book and will lose the right to borrow books till the fine is paid. If the book is not returned even after a month from the date of issue, the matter will be reported to the principal for such action as may be deemed necessary.

- * The Reference books, costly and rare books, Periodicals, reports and books of special collections as well as career guidance books, News Papers, Magazine etc. as "NOT TO BE LENT OUT" are not to be issued outside of the library.
- Loss of Library Card: In case of loss/ damage of library card for the first time, a duplicate one will be issued on payment of Rs.20/-per lending card and Rs. 10/- per reading card. Issue of duplicate card in case of further losses / damages will be at the sole discretion of Principal Librarian and if it is issued will attract a fee of Rs.25/-per card.
- Students appearing for the University Examinations (Part-II and III) must return the library books and the cards and collect a clearance certificate from the librarian before receiving the admit card
- Conversation, talking, sleeping, smoking, Loitering and tiffin taking are not allowed within the library premises.
- The pages of the Newspapers should not be scattered when reading.
- The books should not be misplaced, while selecting from the shelves After reading the books, the same must be kept on the table.
- ❖ At the entering library, all personal belongings shall be deposited at the prescribed counter kept beside the library entrance, and must be taken back when the depositor leaves the library. The library will not be liable for any loss/damage caused to the unclaimed deposits
- * Re-issue/renewal of library book: Any student can re-issue/renew his/her home-issued library book for maximum one time with 7 days duration each, provided the home-issued book has not been on demand by other members of the library.
- Loss of library book: Person held responsible for loss of library book shall be liable to compensate the library by replacing with a new copy current edition of the book lost, damaged, etc. and if the book is not available in the market, he/she must pay the library twice the price of original book.
- Library is a NO MOBILE ZONE. The mobile phone must be kept in silent mode.
- * The college premises should be regarded as no smoking zone.

IDENTITY CARD:

After admission every student will be provided with an Identity Card. Students must come to the college with their Identity Cards and must be show the card at the main entrance of the college on demand, otherwise they will not be allowed to enter the college campus.

COLLEGE CANTEEN:

A spacious canteen is run in the college campus to ensure the supply of nutritious and hygienic food at a subsidised rate to the students.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE:

Annual students' magazine name "SARANIK" is published where students find the scope to express their writing skills and literary talent. Apart from this, Wall Magazine are arranged by various departments where students can give vent to their opinions on different themes and exhibit various artistic endowments.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS):

Our college has a unit of the National Service Scheme (NSS), which employ student volunteers in various community related programmes in and around college campus.



BLOOD DONATION CAMP:

The awareness about the necessity of social interdependence is one of the thoughts that the institution attempts to generate within and outside the college. A step towards achieving this goal is taken in form of organising blood donation camp every year at this college campus by the student union along with the staff and the authority in collaboration with various other organizations. Contributing to the humane cause of supply to blood banks apart, the event helps to create a deeper kind of bonding amongst the donors (students and staff), organizers and beneficiaries and to encourage more arrangements of this kind around the locality.





♣ VIRTUAL CLASSROOM:

The letters hidden in the pages get living, vivid and multidimensional when they are presented through multiple sensory medium. To facilitate the audio visual method of teaching and learning the college provides a well-equipped virtual classroom where each subject is allotted required number of classes.

PARENTS TEACHERS MEETING

In keeping with the academic rigour demanded by undergraduate education, all departments in the college conduct meetings between teachers and parents at periodic intervals. As per the institutional calendar, these parent-teacher meetings happen twice in the first year of admission - viz. after the college mid-term examinations and subsequently, following the publication of pre-university Test results.

The meetings are notified well in advance and are meant as deliberative spaces between all teachers in the department and guardians/parents of students. Not only do teachers discuss the individual performance of students and suggest means of improving the same, but the meetings are also intended to be a feedback mechanism through which the anxieties and concerns of students may be addressed. Also, through a periodic review of each student's academic progress over classroom exercises, class tests and college level examinations, the meetings are effectively a means of understanding the particular problem-areas of every individual student, In this, such spaces of interpersonal engagement and discussion can also become instruments of counselling students with regard to their future possibilities, strengths and focus. Since much suggestion is made in terms of general academic requirements for undergraduate study, the parent-teacher meetings in college are a platform for both one-to-one as well as collective mobilisations of students through specific remedial arrangements with the college.

Understandingly, the parent-teacher meeting have occassioned a lot of earnest engagement over time and thus translating into real improvement of students' performance.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSESSMENT CELL

The IQAC of Kishore Bharati Bhagini Nivedita College was constituted in the year 2011 and reconstituted in the year 2017 in order to maintain the quality and to meet the demand by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council.

OBJECTIVE:

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

First Year:

Classes will commence in the second week of July, 2019. There will be a Mid-Term Examination in October, 2019. College Test will be held in the 2nd week of March, 2020. Filling up of forms for Part-I Examination will commence in the 2nd week of April, 2019.

Class Attendance:

A student must attend at least 75% of the lectures delivered and practical classes held in each subject for being eligible to appear in the concerned University Examination as a regular candidate. A candidate attending less than 75% but not below 60% of the lectures delivered and practical classes held in one or more subject(s) shall be declared "Non Collegiate" and may be allowed to appear in the examination concerned on payment of requisite Non-Collegiate fee payable to the University.

A candidate attending less than 60% of the lectures delivered and practical classes held in one or more subject(s) shall be declared "Non-collegiate" and shall be debarred from appearing in the College Test Examination and the University Examination.

College Hours:

College Timing – 10:00A.M-05:00P.M.(Monday to Saturday) Fees Collection Timings : 11:00 A.M. – 01:30P.M. (Monday to Saturday)

Payment of Tuition Fees:

Tuition fees are due on the first working day of each month and are payable within the month. A last fine of Rupees Ten (Rs. 10/-) is payable for each month's delay. A student who fails to clear college dues within three months, will be treated as defaulter. His/Her name may be restored on payment of a fine of Rs. 10/-only (Readmission fee)

Note: Fees once paid will in no case be refunded.

Notice Board:

Each and every student must consult the general notice board as also the departmental notice boards regularly. The College will not take any responsibility, if any student fails to observe any important notice.

Scholarship, Stipend, Free and Half-Free Studentship:

Schedule Caste and Scheduled Tribe Scholarship / Stipend are granted by the Director of Schedule Caste and Scheduled Tribe Welfare from the office of the Special Officer S.C. and S.T. Welfare, New Treasure Building Alipore, Kolkata-700 027. Prescribed Application forms are available from the College Office immediately after admission.

Exemption for Physically Handicapped Candidates:

All physically handicapped candidates will be exempted from C.U. exam. related fees.

Change of Address:

Any change of address must immediately be communicated to the Principal in writing by the student concerned.

Transfer/Withdrawal Certificate:

A student may apply to the Principal for Transfer/Withdrawal Certificate in his/her favour. Application for Transfer/withdrawal must be signed both by the student and his/her father or legal guardian. All College fees upto the current month and the requisite transfer/withdrawal fee must be paid before such certificate is issued. Students seeking transfer/withdrawal in the middle of a session are required to pay all annual charges in full in addition to the transfer fee. They must also obtain a clearance certificate beforehand from the Librarian and also from the Laboratory for laboratory-based departments, in case of science students.

They are, however, eligible for refund of caution deposit only in terms of the conditions stated above.

Discontinuation of Students:

A Student who wants to discontinue studies from the college without applying for withdrawal of name shall be liable to clear all the college dues up to the current month. If he/she wants to collect any certificate or record from the College Office, he/she may apply on a subsequent date.

Refund of Caution Deposit:

The claim for refund of Caution Deposit for laboratory and / or library is to made after notification by the college, on production of the fee receipt within a year of the date of publication of the corresponding result. Otherwise the amounts will be forfeited. Payment will be made after necessary deductions from Caution Deposits for loss of breakage of laboratory apparatus.

EXCURSION & DEPARTMENTAL FIELD TRIPS

The knowledge lasts longest and acquires greatest depth when it is acquired through joyful learning and ensures creative spontaneity. In order to meet the goal all the departments arrange for educational excursions for the students whether it is mandated the syllabi of university or not. The duration, kind and place vary according to the requirements of respective departments. Geography and zoology departments organize prolonged field trips to fulfil curricular obligation of developing students' scientific and methodical understanding of the globe comprised of uncountable variety of flora and fauna. Arts departments focus on inculcating curiosity about, sympathy and appreciation for nature, historical/archaeological sites, architectural wonders, cultural archives and other places to enliven book-bound learning.



❖ COLLEGE SOCIALS


