Background

Kishore Bharati Bhagini Nivedita College (Co-Ed.), previously known as Kishore Bharati Bhagini Nivedita Girls' College, was founded in the year 2001 with the objective of imparting quality education in subjects under the Arts, Science and Commerce stream. Though our college enjoys an urban locale, most of our students come from relatively remote suburbs and rural areas and a considerable number of students are first generation learners. An inclusive educational programme being the motto, we accommodate large numbers of students belonging to SC, ST, OBC and Minority community. We are functioning continuously to upgrade our service by introducing new subjects and teaching methods in order to keep pace with the changing pattern of higher education in our state and country. We are constantly working to integrate our system with the emergent latest methodologies and application of technologies in higher education.

Vision

The vision of any institution contains the ideological framework within which it designs its performance to achieve its idealistic crux. The primary vision of our college is to create an environment which facilitates an education system ensuring quality and quantitative resources for the students to enable them to tackle the changes and challenges of the technology driven world along with the proliferating possibilities of academia. A cademic Regulations

Regulations relating to Admission and Examinations for the semester-wise Three Year B.A./B.Sc. (Honours/ General) Courses of Studies under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) conducted by the University of Calcutta.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section-54 of The Calcutta University Act 1979, the University of Calcutta hereby makes the following Regulations for Semester-wise 3 year B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours/General) Courses of Studies under CBCS, 2018.

These shall apply to every candidate pursuing the above Courses in this University.

Notwithstanding anything contained in any other regulations or rules for the time being in force the study for the above Courses shall be guided by these Regulations effective from the Academic Session 2018-2019.

- 1. Title and Commencement
- 1.1 These Regulations shall be called THE REGULATIONS FOR SEMESTER-WISE THREE YEAR B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Mus. (Honours/ General) DEGREE PROGRAMMES UNDER CBCS (CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM), UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA.
- 1.2 These Regulations shall come into force with effect from the academic session 2018-2019.
- 2. Duration of the Programme

The 3 year B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours/ General) Programme shall be for a minimum duration of six (6) consecutive semesters of six (6) months each, *i.e.*, three (3) years. The odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.

A candidate pursuing a regular course of study for three-year semester-wise degree course shall have to clear all the semesters in all respects within a span of <u>five years</u> from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the candidate shall stand cancelled.

3. Applicability of the Regulations

These regulations shall be applicable to:

- a. The students who are taking admission to the B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours/ General) Course from the academic session 2018-2019.
- b. The students who were admitted in earlier sessions but did not enroll for B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours/ General) Part I Examinations up to 2018.
- c. The students who were admitted in earlier sessions and enrolled for B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours/ General) Part I Examinations but did not appear in Part I Examinations up to 2018.
- d. The students who were admitted in earlier sessions and appeared in B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours/General) Part I Examinations in 2018 or earlier shall continue to be guided by the existing Regulations of Annual System.

I - ADMISSION REGULATIONS

4(a) A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the 3 year (six semesters) B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours/ General) Course of Studies provided he/she has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in Clauses 5, 11, 12 and 13.

Candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational examination conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the B.A. (General) 1st year Course of Studies taking the subjects under Humanities Division only.

However, no candidate shall be allowed admission after a lapse of more than 5 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating five years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination.

- (b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/ Councils (*i.e.* CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.
- 5. For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours/ General) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate. Marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.
- (a) A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:
 - I. A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination

Or

- II. 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination Or
- III. 50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied [Candidates shall be admitted on the basis of the Admission Test to be conducted by the College Authority concerned.]
- (b) Candidates belonging to Reserved Categories taking up Honours Course of Study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.
- (c) Reservation Policy for admission in three year (six semesters) degree courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014.

6. Attendance

- 6.1 A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- 6.2 A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- 6.3 A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes* held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he /she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.
- * Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is later.

Departmental Activities -

The COVID-19 pandemic is impacting all parts of human society. Everyone is concerned about how the pandemic will affect their families, friends, and people around the world. But we also have a duty to think about how it will impact the world's biodiversity and our ability to protect it, as well as how it might affect the training and careers of field-based subjects.

Across the world, universities and research institutes have shut down. As with other subjects, under graduate courses having practical as critical components are being cancelled or moved online. In practice, this means that professors with little prior online teaching experience are now teaching students with little experience in online learning. This can work well for some topics, but zoology is an applied science and students will miss the practical, hands-on experiences gained through labs and field courses. The consequences will depend on how long the shut-down continues and whether practical components of their training can be postponed until later.

In view of the above, the Department of Zoology has been organising online 'N ature Talk' series on different aspects of conservation and sustainable development to educate students. Three such programs have already been organised and more will be done in next academic session. Students and faculty members of the college had attended the sessions.

Rules & Regulations

Students should make their library cards within 30 days from the commencement of regular classes.

Students are not permitted to enter the library without library cards.

Library cards will have to be shown at the time of entering the library.

Three library cards (2 for lending and 1 for reference) are provided to the students.

The library cards are not transferable.

Students are responsible for the books they use.

Two books of different subjects are issued to a General Course and Honours students can get one book for Honours subject and one for General subject.

At the time of issuing a book, every user is expected to examine carefully and the cases of mutilation, defacement or demand should immediately be brought to the notice of the concerned library staff at the issue counter. Subsequently, the person to whom the book was issued last will be held responsible for the condition of the book and he/she must be compensate either by binding or repairing the book as decided by the College Librarian.

Students are allowed to keep the books lent to them up to 7 days at the most.

Books must be returned by the students on the date specified on the date-label of the book. Defaulters have to pay a fine of Rs.1.00 per day per book and will lose the right to borrow books till the fine is paid. If the book is not returned even after a month from the date of issue, the matter will be reported to the principal for such action as may be deemed necessary.

The Reference books, costly and rare books, Periodicals, reports and books of special collections as well as career guidance books, News Papers, Magazine etc. as 'NOT TO BE LENT OUT' are not to be issued outside of the library.

<u>Loss of Library Card</u>: In case of loss/damage of library card for the first time, a duplicate one will be issued on payment of Rs.20/-per lending card and Rs.10/-for reading card. Issue of duplicate card in case of further losses/damages will be at the sole discretion of Principal and if it is issued will attract a fee of Rs. 25/- per card.

Students appearing for the University Examinations (Part-II and III) must return the library books and the cards and collect a clearance certificate from the Librarian before receiving the admit card.

Conversation, Talking, Sleeping, Smoking, Loitering and Eating are not allowed within the library premises.

The pages of the Newspapers should not be scattered when reading.

The books should not be misplaced, while selecting from the shelves. After reading the books, the same must be kept on the table.

At the entering library, all personal belongings shall be deposited at the prescribed counter kept beside the library entrance, and must be taken back when the depositor leaves the library. The library will not be liable for any loss/damage caused to the unclaimed deposits.

<u>Re-issue/renewal of library books</u>: Any student can re-issue/renew his/her home-issued library book for maximum one time with 7 days duration each, Provided the home-issued book has not been on demand by other users of the library.

<u>Loss of Library book</u>: Person held responsible for loss of library book shall be liable to compensate the library by replacing with a new copy current edition of the book lost, damaged, etc. and if the book is not available in the market, he/she must pay the library twice the price of original book.

Library is a <u>NO MOBILE ZONE</u>. The mobile phone must be kept in silent mode.

The college premises should be regarded as no smoking zone.

Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee

In our college, though the ICC Committee, judges the incidents of sexual harassment within the college campus, however, we also have an Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee.

The Committee often organizes awareness programs, seminars, dialogues and discussions with students etc. and reviews incidents of sexual harassment and refers them to the ICC, as needed.

Kanyashree Prakalpa

Kanyashree Prakalpa (KP), introduced by Government of West Bengal in 2012 is a unique Conditional Cash Transfer scheme which targets adolescent girls aged 13-19 years and offers a two-tier scholarship of an annual Rs. 500 for continuing education (K1) and a one-time payment of Rs. 25,000 on completion of 18, conditional upon the girl remaining unmarried AND continuing education till that age (K2).

The aim of this scheme is two-fold -

To promote secondary education among females, and

To stop marriage of girls before the official age of 18.

In our college all the female students who are eligible to enjoy this scholarship are supported with all official facilities and guidance so that they can avail it for higher education. Even during this pandemic situation, we have co-ordinated with the DPMU and contacted our students both for document submission and physical verification so that they can get their scholarship money within the stipulated time.



Students' Credit Card Scheme

The Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal has introduced the Student Credit Card Scheme (SCCS) for the students of West Bengal to enable them to pursue education without having any financial constraints. A student from West Bengal can obtain a maximum loan of Rs. 10 lakhs @ 4% per annum simple interest from the State Cooperative Bank and its affiliated Central Cooperative Banks and District Central Cooperative Banks and Public/ Private Sector Banks. 1% interest concession will be provided to borrower if the interest is fully serviced during the study period. The upper age limit for the interested students has been kept as 40 (forty) years at the time of applying for loan. The repayment period shall be fifteen (15) years for any loan availed under this Credit Card including the Moratorium/ repayment holiday. Our college also caters all this facilities of Students' Credit Card Scheme.

Other Scholarships

Our college also takes deep interest and supports the students so that they can receive various other scholarships for higher studies like SC/ST Scholarship, Swami Vivekananda Merit Cum Means Scholarship for Minorities, West Bengal. etc.

Eco-Club

The Eco-club of our college is formed in 2015 through which both the teachers and the students of our college participate together to can reach out, influence, engage our surrounding neighbourhood communities to promote sound environmental behaviour through meaningful environmental activities and projects.

The aim of Eco-Club is to motivate the students to keep their *surroundings and campus green and clean* by undertaking plantation of trees, Campaign against banned carry bags, use of loud speakers, banned fireworks, recycling and to promote the culture of conservation of electricity and water by minimizing its use through proper planning and awareness. Every year we also conduct *Eco-Audit* of our College.

Through this forum the students learn to live sustainably and explore environmental concepts and actions beyond the confines of their curriculum. Eco-club of our college organises various events throughout the year to spread awareness about the environment like *World Wetland Day, World Environment Day, International Day for Biological Diversity, Van Mahotsav, World Animal Day* etc. Every year our students also invite all the nearby schools and colleges as well as local residents to take part in this initiative. In this way our college teachers and students are collectively trying to reach out to a large number of locals and encouraging them to take part in these programmes.

This year due to the pandemic situation, we have organized 2 online programs -

1. An Awareness Program on Earth Day, where we have interacted with the students on virtual platform. World Environment Day Quiz where most of our students participated successfully and certificates were given to each and every one declaring their score.



Computer Literacy Cell

The vision is to enhance computer literacy through the use of computers with a range of skills covering levels from elementary use to upgraded courses with assistance from WEBEL. We aim to make our students technically upgraded and skilled in the domain of computer and related hardware. To provide technical support to the students so that they can achieve basic computer knowledge. The committee will look after the matter of the student's prospects in computer related jobs.

Parent-Teacher Meeting

In keeping with the academic rigors demanded by undergraduate education, all departments in the college conduct meetings between teachers and parents at periodic intervals. As per the institutional calendar, these parent-teacher meetings happen twice in the first year of admission – viz. after the college mid-term examinations and subsequently, following the publication of pre-university Test results.

The meetings are notified well in advance and are meant as deliberative spaces between all teachers in the department and guardians/parents of students. Not only do teachers discuss the individual performance of students and suggest means of improving the same, but the meetings are also intended to be a feedback mechanism through which the anxieties and concerns of students may be addressed. Also, through a periodic review of each student's academic progress over classroom exercises, class tests and college level examinations, the meetings are effectively a means of understanding the particular problemareas of every individual student, In this, such spaces of interpersonal engagement and discussion can also become instruments of counselling students with regard to their future possibilities, strengths and focus. Since much suggestion is made in terms of general academic requirements for undergraduate study, the parent-teacher meetings in college are a platform for both one-to-one as well as collective mobilizations of student potential. Also, there are attempts to address the divergent social backgrounds of students through specific remedial arrangements with the college. Understandingly, the parent-teacher meeting has occasioned a lot of earnest engagement over time and thus translating into real improvement of students' performance.

College Canteen

A spacious canteen is run in the college campus to ensure the supply of nutritious and hygienic food at a subsidised rate to the students.

Open Book Exam.

Our college also organizes Open Book Exam. where students are allowed to bring notes, texts and/or other resources into the exam room. This tests the student's ability to analyse and find answers to difficult question and apply the information in solving the problems.

Excursion & Departmental Field Trips

The knowledge lasts longest and acquires greatest depth when it is acquired through joyful learning and ensures creative spontaneity. In order to meet the goal all the departments arrange for educational excursions for the students whether it is mandated the syllabi of university or not. The duration, kind and place vary according to the requirements of respective departments.

Geography and Zoology Departments organize field trips for a longer period of about a week, to fulfil their curricular obligations as per the requirement of the Calcutta University Syllabus. It helps in developing the student's on-field or practical knowledge about the subject. It also helps in scientific and methodical understanding of the various landform features and also in-depth knowledge about the flora and fauna.

Humanities Departments focus on inculcating curiosity, sympathy and appreciation for nature, historical/ archaeological sites, architectural wonders, cultural archives and other places to enliven bookbound learning.

1. First Year:

Amidst this pandemic situation, classes will commence as per the instructions given by the University.

1.1. Class Attendance:

A student must attend at least 75% of the lectures delivered and practical classes held in each subject for being eligible to appear in the concerned University Examination as a regular candidate. A candidate attending less than 75% but not below 60% of the lectures delivered and practical classes held in one or more subject(s) shall be declared "Non-Collegiate" and may be allowed to appear in the examination concerned on payment of requisite Non-Collegiate fee payable to the University.

A candidate attending less than 60% of the lectures delivered and practical classes held in one or more subject(s) shall be declared "Non-Collegiate" and shall be debarred from appearing in the College Test Examination and the University Examination.

1.2. College Hours:

College Timing: 10:00 A.M. - 05:00 P.M. (Monday to Saturday)

Fees Collection Timings: 11:00 A.M. - 01:30 P.M. (Monday to Saturday)

Payment of Tuition Fees:

Tuition fees are due on the first working day of each month and are payable within the month. A late fine of Rupees Ten (Rs. 10/-) is payable for each month's delay. A student, who fails to clear college dues within three months, will be treated as defaulter. His/her name may be restored on payment of a fine of Rs. 10/- only (Readmission fee).

Note: Fees once paid will in no case be refunded.

Notice Board:

Each and every student must consult the general notice board and also the departmental notice boards regularly. The College will not take any responsibility, if any student fails to observe any important notice. Students must follow the college website (http://www.kbbnc.ac.in) regularly for any notice.

Scholarship, Stipend, Free and Half-Free Studentship:

Schedule Caste and Scheduled Tribe Scholarship/ Stipend are granted by the Director of Schedule Caste and Scheduled Tribe Welfare from the office of the Special Officer S.C. and S.T. Welfare, New Treasure Building Alipore, Kolkata - 700027. Prescribed Application forms are available from the College Office immediately after admission.

Exemption for Physically Handicapped Candidates:

All physically handicapped candidates will be exempted from C.U. examinations related fees.

Change of Address:

Any change of address must immediately be communicated to the Principal in writing by the student concerned.

Transfer/Withdrawal Certificate:

A student may apply to the Principal for Transfer/ Withdrawal Certificate in his/her favor. Application for Transfer/ Withdrawal must be signed both by the student and his/her father or legal guardian. All College fees up to the current month and the requisite transfer/withdrawal fee must be paid before such certificate is issued. Students seeking transfer/withdrawal in the middle of a session are required to pay all annual charges in mill in addition to the transfer fee. They must also obtain a clearance certificate beforehand from the Librarian and also from the Laboratory for laboratory-based departments, in case of science students.

They are, however, eligible for refund of caution deposit only in terms of the conditions stated above.

<u>Discontinuation of Students</u>:

A Student who wants to discontinue studies from the college without applying for withdrawal of name shall be liable to clear all the college dues up to the current month. If he/she wants to collect any certificate or record from the College Office, he/she may apply on a subsequent date.

Refund of Caution Deposit:

The claim for refund of Caution Deposit for laboratory and/or library is to made after notification by the college, on production of the fee receipt within a year of the date of publication of the corresponding result. Otherwise the amounts will be forfeited. Payment will be made after necessary deductions from Caution Deposits for loss of breakage of laboratory apparatus.



College Socials


